

## **ANALYZERS HIT 2500**

W. A. Weeks and his associates in their new Holstein Analysis venture, have now made inspections on over 2500 animals. Their files list exceptionally complete type information on all animals, and they plan to start soon on a continuing research program using this great mass of data to uncover the facts on breeding methods and bloodlines as they effect the transmission of type characteristics.

Their clients included breeders from all strata of the business, from the well-known to the unheard-of. Many of the best breeding families they have discovered are in the herds of dairymen who take no part in the official testing or classifying program of the National Association and who may not even belong to a Holstein club. Helping these men to breed better cattle, and to take better advantage of their best transmitting animals is one of the first goals of the program.

In addition to Weeks, Watkins and Blanding, the three original associates, working in Illinois, New York and New England, respectively, they now have the services of Dale Homer in Utah, Earl Marti in Indiana and George Reed in Virginia.
